an exciting new enterprise that translates her bold, fearless paintings into the vivid new language of art glass.

A longtime collector of sculptural glass herself, Wagner is well versed in the exquisite translucence and depth of color made possible in this medium. And two years ago, her bright colors and abstract designs won her the singular opportunity to submit her designs to one of the leading enterprises in Murano art glass, Marco Polo Glass Gallery and Studio near Venice.

Initially, Wagner composed colored "paintings" which then were captured in crystal by the gallery's maestros-among them Walter Furlan, who also worked directly with Picasso in translating many of his designs into glass. Wagner's prototypes were an instant success. She began spending months at a time in Venice, working directly with the studio's masters to produce the unique, limited-edition glass sculptures that so wondrously complement her paintings.

Since she started producing her

designs in glass, Wagner's paintings seem to reflect the excitement she
