

## What a Difference a Volunteer Makes:

The value of a volunteer, according to the independent sector, is \$28.54 per hour.

### Statistics for the 2021 year at PASS

**Evening Advocate:** 7 nights a week, one volunteer a night, three hours each night=1095 hours a year, valued at \$31,250.30. Endless support for PASS guests=Priceless

**Meal Providers:** 7 nights a week, 2-5 hours per meal: 730-1825 hours a year, valued at \$22,261.20 - \$52,085.50. A full stomach of delicious and nutritious food=Priceless

**Office Hours:** 5 mornings a week, 3 hours each morning=780 hours, valued at \$22,261.20. Having a consistent presence in the community=Priceless

**Overnight Advocate:** 6 hours a night= 2190 hours a year, valued at \$62,502.60. Having someone at the shelter in case of an emergency=Priceless.

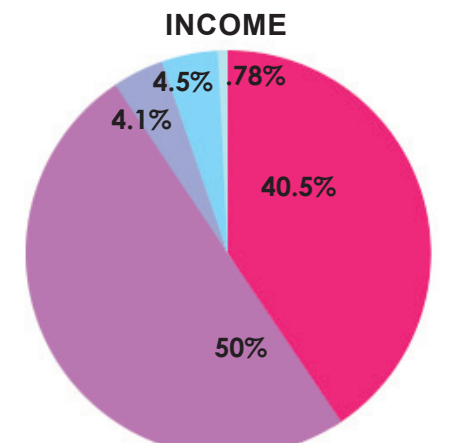
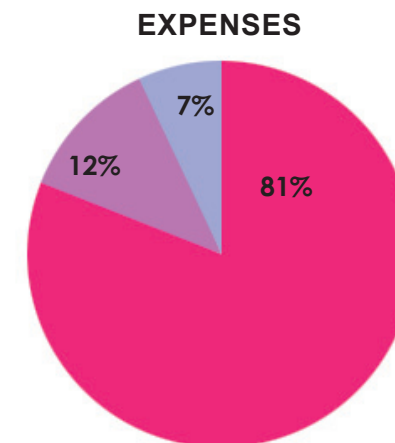
