Statistics for the 2023 year at PASS

The value of a volunteer, according to the independent sector is \$31.80 per hour.

Evening Advocate: 7 nights a week, one to two volunteers a night, three hours each night= 1638 hours a year, valued at \$52,088.40. Endless support for PASS guests=Priceless

Meal Providers: 7 nights a week, 2-5 hours per meals: 730-1825 hours a year, valued at \$23,214.00 - \$58,035.00 A full stomach of delicious and nutritious food=Priceless

Office Hours: 5 mornings a week, 3 hours each morning=780 hours, valued at \$24,804.00. Having a consistent presence in the community=Priceless

Overnight Advocate: 6 hours a night= 2190 hours a year, valued at \$69,642.00. Having someone at the shelter in case of an emergency=Priceless

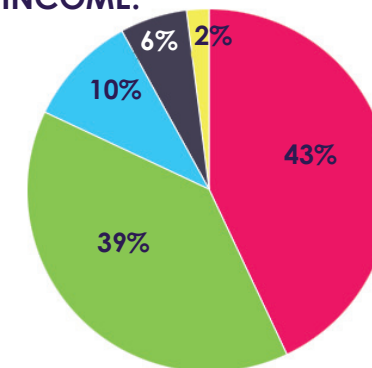

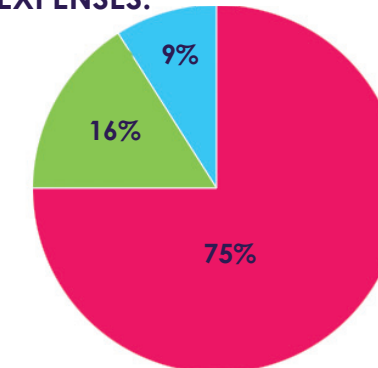
